[Montréal's Gay Village \(Le Village\)](#) is one of the largest and most vibrant LGBTQ+ neighbourhoods in North America. Centred along Sainte-Catherine Street East, it stretches between Berri-UQAM and Papineau metro stations and is famous for its lively patio culture, inclusive atmosphere, and vibrant nightlife.

The compact Gay Village has an upbeat vibe and a lively club scene. In summer, the main drag, Rue Sainte-Catherine, is pedestrian-only and strung with pink decorations, and bars and eateries spill onto terraces in the street. Rue Amherst

is known for its boutiques and antiques shops. Nearby, the neoclassical Saint-Pierre-Apôtre Church contains the Chapel of Hope, dedicated to AIDS victims. Drop by to shop, dine, raise a glass, gather and explore.

Housed in an ultra-modern architectural setting with towering windows bathing the interior in light, this restaurant offers diners a wonderful view of the brigade at work in the glass-paned kitchen. The chef is the son of farmers from France. Fusing French culinary traditions with the riches of Québec's terroir, his menu celebrates premium ingredients: lobster from the Magdalen Islands, king crab, Appalachian red deer, scallops and caviar. Fragrant consommés, velvety creams, and complex sauces point to significant culinary expertise. The meal is also suffused with nostalgia: crispy pork rinds are served with the aperitif; there is a maple pre-dessert. Silver service brings a pleasant theatrical element to your table.
